

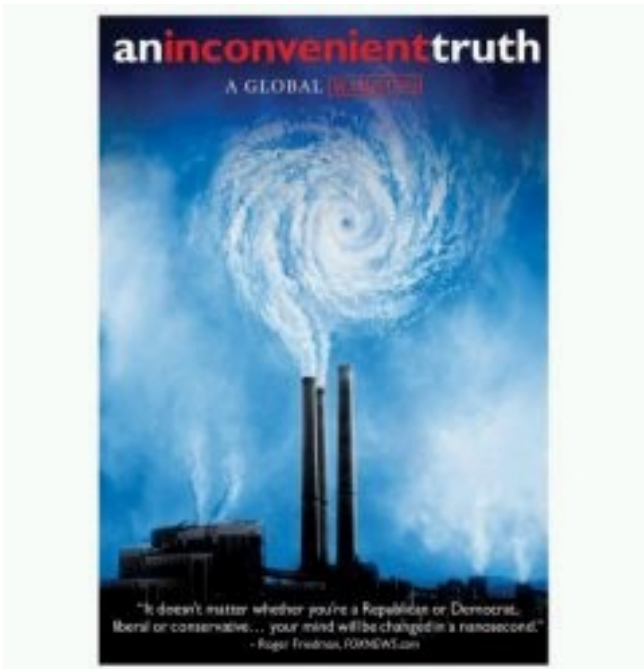
# SaskEnergy Youth Enviro-Action Symposium April 23, 2007

# Al Gore coming to Regina!

### Biography

U.S. Vice President and Senator. Born Albert Arnold Gore, Jr. on March 31, 1948 in Washington, D.C. His father was a Democratic representative and senator from Tennessee. Albert Jr graduated from Harvard (1969) and served as an army reporter in Vietnam.

Gore served in the House of Representatives (Democrat, Tennessee, 1977–85) and the US Senate (Democrat, Tennessee, 1985–93). He made an unsuccessful run for the 1988 Democratic presidential nomination, but in 1993 became Vice President under [Bill Clinton](#). During his tenure, he worked to cut back on government bureaucracy, and received the Democratic nomination for the presidency in 2000. He conceded defeat to [George W. Bush](#) after five weeks of complex legal argument over the voting procedure in the presidential election.

Especially noted for his interest in environmental issues, Gore wrote *Earth in the Balance: Healing the Global Environment* (1992). He lectures widely on the topic of global warming and starred in the film *An Inconvenient Truth* in 2006. The film included Gore's lectures and research on the topic and went on to become the third-highest grossing documentary in U.S. history.
