Thom Collegiate students are very devoted to their annual Terry Fox fundraiser, which began 11 years ago after a Thom student was diagnosed with cancer. Initially designed to support their peer, the fundraiser has become an annual tradition as an opportunity to help support cancer research.

This year the students set an ambitious goal of \$15,000. To help them meet their goal, the students held various fundraisers, including a “Taco-in-a-bag” lunch event for employees at SaskEnergy Place, a hat day, an annoying song day - where people had to pay to turn off whichever annoying song was played - a chuck bucket, a charity dodge ball game, and a pass the pie campaign.



On Friday, May 7th Thom’s Student Representative Council held a pep rally where SaskEnergy’s **Gus the Gas-a-saurus** helped announce this year’s total. Over the past 11 years, Thom Collegiate has raised over **\$200,000** for this great cause.
